It has been a very busy year for BAWCS, in particular with our Community Support Programs flourishing. These programs specifically target disadvantaged pet owners, including the elderly, the homeless, the pension holder (including single parent and disability) and those that face challenging personal circumstances including victims of domestic violence, the incarcerated, the mentally and physically unwell. Our client base is many and the service providers we have partnered with this year include Aged Persons Mental Health Service, Bendigo Community Health Services, EASE (Emergency Accommodation Services Enterprise), St Lukes, Bendigo Uniting Care, Haven (formerly Loddon Mallee Housing), Bendigo Health – Mobile Support Services, Vincentcare Victoria and Vision Australia.

Support in general for disadvantaged pet owners has been in demand also. Amazing how just the simple purchase of a dog bed to a dog that has to sleep on a concrete floor in a garage whilst his owner is in temporary accommodation, or transportation of pets to new accommodation from temporary when you don't have a car, can make all the difference. What a lot of us take for granted and are able to buy without a second thought is often extremely challenging to those facing circumstances beyond their control. Other support provided has including paying pound release fees (people often just need the time to get the money together), veterinary care, including minor to major procedures and of course very important, and supporting responsible pet ownership, desexing. BAWCS has a wholistic approach and if an animal is being desexed, we also encourage microchipping and vaccination.

Our relationship with the **local RSPCA**, who operate the Pound for the City of Greater Bendigo has also strengthened and we have been able to assist with dog reclaims (as previously mentioned), referrals for adoptions and in one particular case of note, veterinary care for a disadvantage pet owner whose elderly dog

needed to be put to sleep but couldn't afford to go to the vet. The Pound is not the place where a beloved pet should have its last hours so we were able to ensure this dear dog's last hours were spent quietly and put to sleep with dignity.

Our support of these organisation's and their clients has only been possible with the great support of grants received from 2010 State Trustees Australia Foundation – Jean Memorial Fund, and Bendigo Uniting Care Outreach Distribution Fund. We have applied to these organisations again for funding for our 2012 programs.

As BAWCS does not have kennels yet, we have been working with a third party boarding kennel who have been extremely understanding about the circumstances in which dogs are being boarded with them, including the fees they are charging. BAWCS often picks up the entire cost of this accommodation which is more often required in emergency situations.

Without doubt, our **Community Support Programs** have been and continue to be, a major focus of the work we do and we look forward to continuing this important work with the generous support of our partners.

Latest update on facility development

Whilst BAWCS continues to support our community with our much in demand services, our Building Project is ticking away in the background.

For those that don't know, we are building new facilities on 30 acres in Huntly North allowing us to greatly expand on the work we are currently doing.

The first 6 months of this year has not been without drama, in particular due to the flooding of our site with the torrential rains. To add to this, the contractor engaged to complete our 500metre driveway kept putting our job off and in the end, pulled out of the contract altogether! Needless to say we were extremely disappointed especially when we have wasted so much time in getting this important part of our project completed. Without the driveway, you cannot get onto the property including getting to the Caretaker's Residence which has been waiting to be finished for some months now. We engaged a new contractor and the driveway was finished quickly and we have been able to forge ahead with getting the Caretaker's Residence completed. When we have someone living onsite we will relocate our Farm Friends Program animals to Huntly North and our current rehoming of unwanted kittens and cats will continue from the new site.

As further funding becomes available, we will continue to develop our facilities to include our much anticipated kennels and pet boarding facility. It is a big project and we thank everyone who continues to support us along the way.


Goodwill Wines partners with BAWCS

The love I leave behind.




