We are **moving!** After 12 months at 32 High Street Bendigo, the Committee has decided not to renew our lease, instead to move to smaller and more affordable premises. Effective **Wednesday 4 August** you will find us at the **Central Bendigo Enterprise Centre** at **43 Williamson Street Bendigo** (next door to Australia Post). We will no longer have a shop front and office, instead a great new office suite which will serve us well in continuing to provide support for the community. You will still be able to drop off donations of cat food / blankets etc. and of course pick up great educational material. You will also be able to purchase bricks in our **Buy a Brick Program** to help build our new facilities at Huntly North – an update on our Brick Program later in this newsletter.

The merchandise we have been selling at our Centre will be stored and sold at the many markets we attend, in particular The Showgrounds Market each Sunday. We will have a small amount of items available for sale at 43 Williamson Street so if you are looking for a particular item, (our cat toys are especially popular!) let us know and we will make sure we have it available.

Our office will be open **Wednesdays** to **Fridays** between **10am and 4pm** and we will have the same telephone number of **5444 5783**.

We've been busy as usual......

It has been a busy time for us with lots of support being provided to disadvantaged pet owners in particular via our **BUCO Program** (veterinary care funding support provided by the Bendigo Uniting Care Outreach Distribution Fund). Veterinary care can be out of reach to many pet owners but with BAWCS assistance, pet owners have been able to receive the care their pets have needed, including acting responsibly by having their pets desexed.

Sometimes it is time for our pets to leave us to go to *The Rainbow Bridge* and this was the case with 'Sam' whose heart condition was not treatable. A referral from **Uniting Care Outreach Kangaroo Flat** to BAWCS allowed the owners to end Sam's suffering. Our sympathies are extended to Sam's family as they now face life without their little friend.

Helping ill pet owners

Bendigo Health recently contacted us for support via their **Hospital Admission Risk Program (HARP**). We are currently providing care for several cats whose owner has been hospitalised for an undetermined period of time. The last thing you need to be worrying about when you are ill is your pet's care. BAWCS is pleased to be able to work in partnership with **HARP** to provide this important service.

Latest update on facility development

Bendigo Animal Welfare & Community Services (BAWCS) is delighted to be the recipient of funding from the Bendigo Northern District Community Enterprise (BNDCE) Small Grants Program, in conjunction with Bendigo Bank and Bendigo Community Telco, to support landscaping works on our site at 488 Millwood Road Huntly North.

Working in partnership with CVGT National Green Jobs Corps Program, BAWCS will plant an attractive screening of native shrubs along our northern boundary which will enhance the character of the endemic native vegetation blending in with the current vegetation on the site. The landscaping works will also reduce the visual impact of the building development both from within the site and externally and has been approved as part of our Landscaping Plan by the City of Greater Bendigo. The Project will not only provide environmental improvements in the form of many new native trees planted but will also assist young unemployed people to build their skills via environmental work experience, allowing for greater employment opportunities.

We take this opportunity to thank the **BNDCE Small Grant Program Committee** and our new partners **CVGT National Green Jobs Corps Program** for their support.

Pets and new babies

It is disturbing how many calls BAWCS receives from people wanting to surrender their pets because they have a new baby in the home. Sometimes these pets have been with the family for many years and it is distressing to think that just because a baby has arrived, the pet has to be disposed of, usually because the new parents fear for the safety of the new arrival. Whilst it can be challenging for a pet that has been the centre of attention for this change to be happening, taking the time to prepare your pet for the new human arrival can be simple and effective ensuring no reason to get rid of your pet. Familiarising your pet with the new baby's scent by bringing home a blanket from the hospital can be a good start and on arrival home and making sure the pet is not ignored when the baby is present. Please contact us if you would like more information on

this process. Once children start to crawl, parents must be vigilant in preparing the pet (especially a dog) for what may happen with squeezing, poking and the



like from the child. Never leave a young child, especially under 6, unsupervised with a pet. More information is available through BAWCS. Don't betray the trust of an animal that asks so little of you but gives you so much in return just because you have a new family member which in time will benefit greatly from having an animal in their lives, just as you have.

Support for Black Saturday 18 months on

Back in February 2009, BAWCS was called in to assist pet owners who had been affected by the Black Saturday bushfire. We saw a stream of distressed people arriving at the Kangaroo Flat Support Centre, some with all of their pets, others with only some of their pets, and tragically, people that had left their pets behind. Bendigo Community Health Services (BCHS) Bushfire Relief Program has been assisting victims and recently referred one of their clients to us who required support for their dogs. Pets In Crisis, one of our Community Support Programs is specifically set up to assist pet owners in need and we have assisted a family with caring for their beloved pets.

We have had a fantastic response to our request for knitted (and other) dog coats.
